

... a large number of bats entering living areas, caused by a maternity roost that had been sealed in accidentally during building works!








### FROM YOUR COORDINATORS...





#### START YOUR JOURNEY INTO BAT CARE...


As you know, BCT maintains a list of bat carers, ambulance drivers and regional helplines throughout the UK known as the UK Bat Care Network. Thanks to the Network, these bats have the best possible chance of being rehabilitated and released back into the wild.



Bat care volunteering is done on a local basis, generally through bat groups. Carers don't volunteer directly for The Bat Conservation Trust, but by choosing to be listed on the UK Bat Care Network, they can help ensure that people who find grounded or injured bats are referred on to them.
