DOCTOR'S DECLARATION (Northern Ireland)

In Northern Ireland, the rabies vaccine is available free of charge for licensed non-occupational bat handlers (e.g., bat work undertaken in a voluntary capacity) via their GP using an HS21 prescription. GPs can obtain supplies of **free** vaccine and have access to advice on rabies immunisation from the Public Health Agency on 0300 555 0114.
